In the Waiting God does not take shortcuts

1 Samuel 16:1-3

¹The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way; I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king."

²But Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears about it, he will kill me."

The LORD said, "Take a heifer with you and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the LORD.' Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what to do. You are to anoint for me the one I indicate."

Illustration

- Have you ever seen someone who was in the process of making a horrible decision?
- You are on the outside watching and you can see what's happening and no matter what you do you can't stop it.
- It's like you see the train coming it's rolling around the bend. And I ain't seen the sunshine since I don't know when.
- I have this gift of seeing other people's mistakes.
- Problem is sometimes I can't see my own.
- It's like where did that come from? How did that happen?

- Wednesday night Jami sent someone to come get me.
- Luke was in distress.
- Luke hospital, waiting for his reaction to milk, gave him EpiPen and waited.

Transition

- What can we learn from them?
- What lessons can we take from these kings and queens that will help us?
- You are a king or queen of your kingdom.
- Before God reveals your destiny, he takes you through transition.
- Many times, your desert precedes your destiny.

Illustration

Before Jesus entered his public ministry the Spirit of God led him to the desert.

Matthew 4:1

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

Application

- Some of you are in a wilderness and it may be that what led you to your wilderness is not God abandoning you but God leading you.
- It may be that God is not punishing you but he is positioning you for what he has next.
- God is looking for servants.
- Be a servant in your kingdom

 - 3. David had some DRIP.

- David went back to the sheep.
- Where was David found? Doing what he was last told to do.
- His new anointing did not immediately mean a new position.
- His position remained the same.
- God used his position to grow him into his anointing.
- David was anointed but had to grow into what God had for him.
- God began to advance him where he was before God moved him to his next assignment.
- His assignment before he was anointed was to serve his father as a shepherd.
- God used David's faithfulness where he was planted to promote him to his next assignment.
- I have to learn what God has for me right now before I can move to what he has for me next.

<u>I Samuel 16:13</u>

1 Samuel 16:19-23

- ¹⁹ Then Saul sent messengers to Jesse and said, "Send me your son David, who is with the sheep." ²⁰ So Jesse took a donkey loaded with bread, a skin of wine and a young goat and sent them with his son David to Saul.
- ²¹ David came to Saul and entered his service. Saul liked him very much, and David became one of his armor-bearers. ²² Then Saul sent word to Jesse, saying, "Allow David to remain in my service, for I am pleased with him."
- ²³ Whenever the spirit from God came on Saul, David would take up his lyre and play. Then relief would come to Saul; he would feel better, and the evil spirit would leave him.
 - 3. He became **VERY BOLD**!!! learned how to face his fears.

I Samuel 17:32

- ³² David said to Saul, "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him."
- ³³ Saul replied, "You are not able to go out against this Philistine and fight him; you are only a young man, and he has been a warrior from his youth."
- ³⁴ But David said to Saul, "Your servant has been keeping his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and carried off a sheep from the flock, ³⁵ I went after it, struck it and rescued the sheep from its mouth. When it turned on me, I seized it by its hair, struck it and killed it. ³⁶ Your servant has killed both the lion and the bear; this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, because he has defied the armies of the living God. ³⁷ The LORD who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine."

Application

1 Samuel 18:12-16

¹² Saul was afraid of David, because the LORD was with David but had departed from Saul. ¹³ So he sent David away from him and gave him command over a thousand men, and David led the troops in their campaigns. ¹⁴ In everything he did he had great success, because the LORD was with him. ¹⁵ When Saul saw how successful he was, he was afraid of him. ¹⁶ But all Israel and Judah loved David, because he led them in their campaigns.
